Call to Order

Mayor Jensen called the meeting to order at 4:30 p.m.

Victim's Assistance Coordinator Program - Presented by Police Chief Steve Dve

Stephanie Paulson and Samantha Tello, Victim Assistance Coordinators, updated Council on their work with victims of violent crime and with victims of other types of crime. As coordinators, they assist with obtaining protective orders; crisis intervention; Crime Victims' Compensation; education and counseling. Ms. Paulson said they meet with victims, review offense reports, and follow up with the victim. They provide information on resources; assist detectives with getting copies of necessary documents from the victim; and document each step of their interaction with the victim, detective or contact made on behalf of the victim. She said they are on call 24/7 for additional support in the event of a crisis.

Prairie Lights Traffic Plan - Presented by Rick Herold, Parks, Arts and Recreation Director

Rick Herold, Parks and Recreation Director, stated that Prairie Lights are now in Round Rock and Sugarland which allows Grand Prairie to move the shows around each year. Grand Prairie receives 50% of the gate in these cities.

Beverly Grogan, Prairie Lights Manager, invited Council to VIP night, on Monday, November 24. She said there will be a new laser show inside, dancing trees, and a new VIP experience which will provide an opportunity for those who do not want to wait in line to do a "fast pass." They will start at Loyd Park and will be brought into the park on a bus, they will have a special seating area, discounts on food and gifts, and will be returned to Loyd Park. The VIP bus will run on Fridays, Saturdays, holidays and Christmas week.

Mr. Herold said staff had met numerous times to identify options for reducing wait times and traffic congestion. One of those changes is telling people new available routes. Police Chief Steve Dye said that with Lynn Creek Parkway now open this will maximize queue space and minimize wait time. Also, additional message boards will be placed on I20, Great Southwest Parkway and SH360, to let them know of the various ways to approach Prairie Lights. Walter Shumac, Transportation Director, said staff is trying to manage traffic better to make it a good experience for visitors.

Council Member Wooldridge asked if more barricades will be used. Chief Dye replied if traffic is backed up at Camp Wisdom, police will be keeping that intersection clear. Mr. Shumac said cones will be more dense this year to keep traffic from cutting in between them. Council Member Copeland suggested the VIP experience be advertised on the message boards. Mr. Herold said the "fast pass" is available only online to make sure bus space is available.

Council Member Copeland asked if it would be possible to have a message on the boards to order online and come back another night if the wait is too long. Mr. Herold said that a 3-day notice is required for the busses. Council Member Copeland asked if port-a-potties could be placed on Lake Ridge and Lynn Creek. Chief Dye said he was concerned that some areas are not brightly lit and going in and out of traffic was not safe. Ms. Grogan said there were port-a-potties as you enter the park and one right before the gate as they are in the park. Council Member Copeland asked if someone could be taking money from the queued cars before they reach the toll booth. Ms. Grogan said they had experimented with that last year, but there is still gridlock in the park anyway on busy nights.

Grand Prairie ISD Update - Presented by Dr. Susan Hull, GPISD Superintendent, and Teri Wilson, GPISD Chief of Staff

Dr. Susan Hull, Grand Prairie ISD Superintendent, addressed the Council regarding student achievement. Dr. Hull stated that GPISD is 88% non-Anglo with 65% Hispanic students. She gave several statistics of student performances on state tests. She said one of the goals for the GPISD students is to close the performance gap as compared to the State. She said high school graduates had closed the gap, and in 2014, students in grades 3-8 were 9.2% ahead of the state. Dr. Hull said 30% of GPISD student are second language learners and there has been a 14.7% growth in the number of Hispanic students taking AP exams compared to 10.5% Texas growth. The graduation rate is at 89.4% compared to the State at 88%. Council Member Copeland asked if Dubiski affected those rates positively. Dr. Hull replied Dubiski is a school of choice and there are no extracurricular opportunities and there is a 98% graduation rate at Dubiski.

S140501 - Site Plan - Mira Lagos East Phase 2 (City Council District 6). Approve a lot consolidation of two contiguous multi-family residential lots within the same development for the purpose of development review. The 19.44 acre property, located at 2629 S. Grand Peninsula Drive, is zoned Planned Development District 298-A (PD-298A) and is within the Lake Ridge Overlay District. The agent is Daniel Dewey, JBI Partners, Inc., the applicant is Ben McCaslin, Mira Lagos East Partners Ltd., and the owner is Walter Damon, Mira Lagos East Partners Ltd. (On November 3, 2014, the Planning and Zoning Commission recommended approval of this request by a vote of 8-0.)

Jim Hinderaker, Chief City Planner, stated that this case was for a lot consolidation to enable the developer to not have to consider interior property lines with regard to setbacks. He said the applicant's original request asked for a variance to the masonry fence requirement but that had been withdrawn by the applicant.
