I have observed several mornings the arrival of employees to open the facility for business. The property is practically across the street from our home. The possibility of someone driving a U Haul into the facility and unload furniture into a metal building at a late hour is something nobody wants to be abruptly awoken too due to the noise level it may produce. I am sure you would not want that either if you lived by a storage center.

This facility agreed to terms of their permit to remain open only from 6 am to 9 pm and we feel they should continue to uphold their agreement including having an onsite manager 24 hours a day and not have their hours changed.
